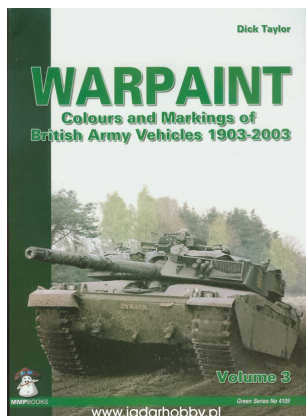

This book, Volume 3 in a series of four, describes and illustrates post WW2 camouflage and markings as follows:

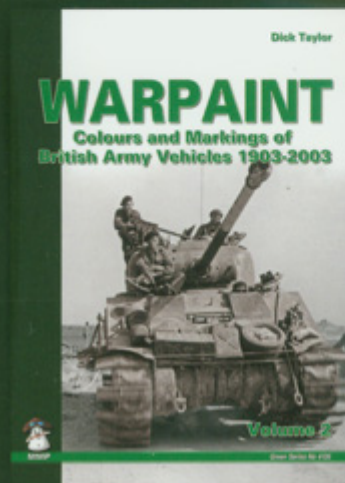
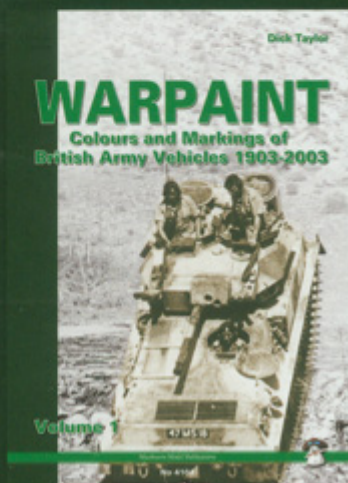

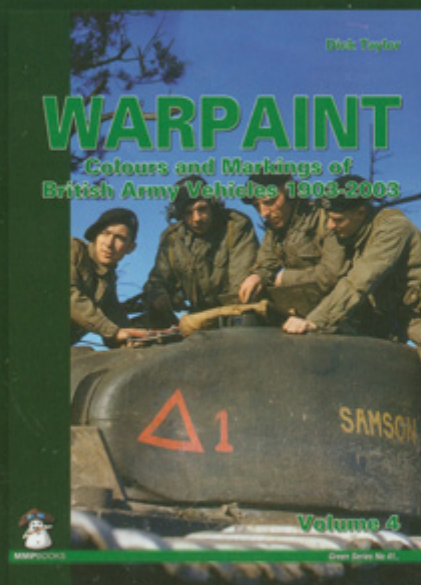
Chapter 3 Formation Signs,

Above: Royal Signals units used Red numbers for contrast, sometimes outlined in White on the Blue half.

Right: A10 CALM, the 9 Tp Sgt C Sqn SRTR in Greece 1941 bears the AOS serial 52 on Red on the nose. The Sqn geometric colour should be Yellow but was probably regimental Green at this time.

An unidentified alpha-numeric AOS - probably SRTR - in late 1941 or early 1942.

THE AIRBORNE DIVISIONS

⇨ 1st AIRBORNE DIVISION.

Formed in November 1941, it fought in Sicily and NW Europe, before moving to Norway at the end of the war. Pegasus was meant to face right.

⇨ 6th AIRBORNE DIVISION.

Formed in May 1943, it fought in NW Europe. The use of exactly the same divisional insignia as another active formation - 1st Airborne - is unique.

THE ROYAL MARINE DIVISION

The design used a Gold (or Yellow) trident, the weapon of Britannia and Neptune, on a Red shield pointing downwards.

THE ARMoured AND TANK BRIGADES*

Many of the Army Tank/Tank and Armoured Brigades changed titles at different stages during the war, to reflect their organisations and roles; the insignia tended to stay fairly constant however. The Diabolo signs used by the Tank Brigades were often outlined in White, to make them more visible, and some Brigades employed a 'squashed', fatter version of the symbol.



⇨ 1st TANK BRIGADE**.

A Red Diabolo was used, and was the recognised geometric design for most of the Army Tank brigades.



⇨ 1st ARMoured BRIGADE GROUP.

The design used was a Red Tiger's Head on a White disc or square.

2nd ARMoured BRIGADE.

This came into being in Italy in October 1944, and re-used the old 1st Armoured Division Rhinoceros design after that division was disbanded in early 1945.

* Whilst Brigade insignia existed, they were not always used; Divisional signs being used instead. In most cases, only independent Brigades displayed their own signs.

** These brigades were known as Army Tank Brigades until 1942.
